 - 1 A pound (£) sign
 - 2 Some metal bars (on a prison)
 - 3 Two goats
 - 4 A frank (like a stamp) from an envelope
 - 5 Some beads
 - 6 A silver star
 - 7 A legal paper tied with red ribbon
 - 8 A broken pair of spectacles
 - 9 A sandal
 - 10 An hour-glass
 - 11 A photograph hanging from a peg

2 A piece of paper like a cheque. Someone can send you a money order so they do not have to send you bank-notes through the post. It is safer to send a money order.

3 Adam (of Minta)/(The Village of) Minta/Farmer/ Martha/ 1/3

4 *Main points only. Students should not include every small detail.*

Day Two: Adam goes to Darpur./He goes to the Post Office./The Post Office official tells Adam to get an Identity Card./Adam goes to the Ministry of the Interior./An official gives him a form./Adam goes to Rick's shop./Rick shows Adam the way to a photographer./The photographer takes photos of Adam./Adam gives the photographer two pounds./The photographs are not ready./Adam goes home.

Day Three: Adam stays at home./The school teacher fills in his form.

Day Four: Adam goes to Darpur./He goes to the photographer's house./The photographer is not there./The photographer returns after a long time./The photographer does not give him the photographs and asks for a receipt./Adam hits him with his stick./A policeman takes Adam to the police station./The policeman sends Adam back to his village.

Day Five: The school teacher gives Adam a letter to take to Mr Sheth./Adam goes to Mr Sheth's house in Darpur./Mr Sheth reads the letter./He tells Adam the money order is worth nothing./He brings Adam coffee and cakes./He gives Adam ten pounds.

5 *Student's own answer. Possible answers:*
Good/Helpful Men: School teacher, Saul, Rick.
Bad/Unhelpful Men: Post Office official, Photographer, Ministry of the Interior official. *Adam and Mr Sheth could be put in either list. Students could justify their answers.*

6 (a) *Student's own answer. Saul may say how he is, ask whether his parents are well, whether they got the money order, what they have spent the money on.*
 (b) *Adam may tell Saul what has happened with the money order. Or he may pretend that nothing went wrong.*
