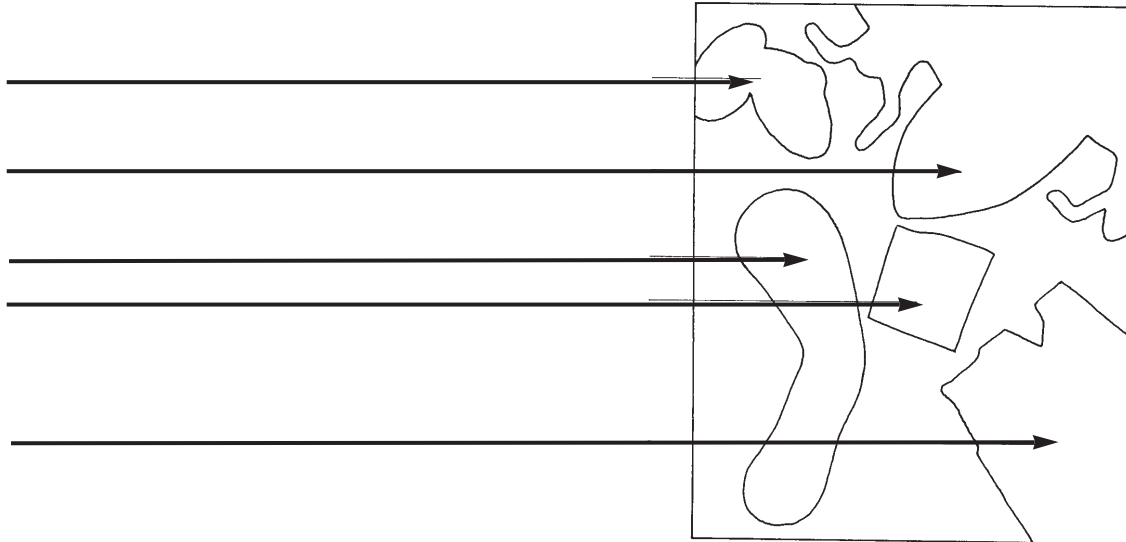

Then I'll come to London with you.'

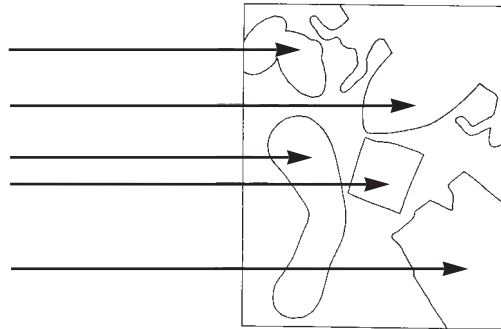


'I left the door open for you. I wanted you to
