A Before Reading

- These stories are set in the early twentieth century in England, just after the First World War. Life was very different then compared to now. Are the following statements about this time true or false?

- D. H. Lawrence was an important writer. He thought it was important to discuss everything, even things that people thought were too difficult to talk about. He thought that people should live their lives completely. He thought women should be able to live how they wished. His writing upset a lot of people.
 - What do you think he wrote about that upset so many people?
 - What do you think is meant by 'living completely'?
 - What stopped women from living how they wished?
 - How do you think they wished to live?
- How were things different in your country at this time compared to now?

5 *The Lovely Lady*. Match the first half of the sentence on the left with the second half on the right.


Pauline Attenborough was seventy-two years old but	didn't know Ciss was listening.
