
# **Welcome to my blog**








#### Third culture kids

Third culture kids (or "TCKs") is a term first used by researcher Dr. Ruth Hill Useem. It is used to describe children who are born in one country but grow up in a different country. Often, this is because their parents work abroad. As worldwide travel becomes easier, there are more and more TCKs.
