Jen doesn't like Danny because he has a bad reputation. She has several different feelings about Billy. She doesn't want to be his girlfriend again, but she gets very excited when she sees him.

- 3 Doug Witter—Pacey's brother—talks to Abby Morgan. He finds out about Pacey and Dawson's trip to New York. He tells his father about it.
- 6 1 Billy and Danny are waiting for them in a gold-colored carriage, pulled by a white horse.
- 2 She tells Joey, "My aunt and uncle are very rich—they like everyone to know that." She isn't surprised about the amount of money they have spent on the party.
- 7 1 Because they are not wearing formal clothes.
- 2 Joey is angry with Dawson and Pacey. But she is angrier about the way that Jen and her family have behaved to her. So she wants to help Dawson.
- 8 1 He thinks, "If I behaved perfectly every day for a year, Dad and Doug still wouldn't like me."
- 2 Because Mrs Hanover's car has broken down. There is a hole in one of its tires. They need to find a garage to repair the tire.
- 9 1 Dawson has lied to his parents. He has been to New York without their permission. Dawson is in trouble. He guesses this from the sound of his father's voice and from the questions that Mr Leery asks him.
- 2 Because Pacey stopped to help Mrs Hanover, although this made him late home. And he didn't take the money that she tried to give him.
